

FRANCES BRANNEN VICK

Frances Brannen Vick is retired director and co-founder of the University of North Texas Press and founder and President of E-Heart Press, Inc. She holds B.A. and M.A. degrees in English from the University of Texas at Austin and Stephen F. Austin State University, respectively, and a Doctor of Humane Letters (honoris causa) from the University of North Texas. She taught English at several universities before beginning a publishing career in 1977, publishing Texas Folklore Society Publications among other publications. The University of North Texas Press, founded in 1987, under her leadership published from sixteen to twenty books a year. She is co-author of *Petra's Legacy: The South Texas Ranching Empire of Petra Vela and Mifflin Kenedy*, with Jane Monday, which won the Coral Horton Tullis Award for the best book on Texas history in 2007. She is editor of *Literary Dallas*, and author of the Carl Hertzog Lecture Series monograph, "Confessions of a Texas Publisher/Writer," and *One Hundred Years of "The Eyes of Texas."* She has written introductions and chapters for such books as *Texas Women Writers*, *The Family Saga: A Collection of Texas Family Legends*, which she also helped edit, *Texas Women on the Cattle Trails*, and *Notes from Texas Writers*.



She is past president of the Texas Institute of Letters; past president of the Texas State Historical Association; a Fellow of the Texas Folklore Society; member of The Philosophical Society of Texas; Life Member of the Texas State Historical Association and the East Texas Historical Association, and the Leadership Texas Alumni Association. She is a member of the Presidents Council, and an Honorary Alumna of the University of North Texas. At the University of Texas at Austin, she is a member of Advisory Boards of the College of Liberal Arts, and a member of the Development Board; Life Member of the Texas Exes. At Texas A&M University she is a member of the Advisory Council of Texas A&M University Press.

She received the *Pro Bene Meritis* Liberal Arts Award from The University of Texas, Austin, and The Humanities Texas Award from Humanities Texas in 2009. She was the Doctoral Commencement and Hooding Ceremony speaker at the University of North Texas Graduate School Spring 2009.
